Presentation of the Marie Curie Actions (MCA)

 The Marie Curie Actions are the "People" Programme of the 7th Framework Programme


(the "People" Programme is one of the 4 specific programmes of FP7: Cooperation, Ideas (ERC), People, Capacities.)

- The applications are done through competitive calls for proposals (publication of WP and calls by end of June)
- The proposals evaluation is done by independent experts (Quality of the Science and Technology, Training/Transfer of knowledge, Implementation, Impact)



The budget of the MCA

With M€ 4750 of € 50 521 millions the MCA budget represent the third most important one of FP7 after the Programme *Cooperatio*n and *ERC*

The specificities of the Marie Curie Actions (MCA)

- The MCA support mobility, carrier development and life long training of researchers
- Mobility is to be understood as :
 - International (intra-European or outside EU),
 - Intersectoriel,
 - Interdisciplinary (3 I).
- They fund all the domains of research (bottom-up approach) : the candidates freely choose they domain of research

No age limit

The different types of researchers in the MCA

- Early stage researchers (ESR) < 4 years
- Experienced Researchers (ER) > 4 years or PhD
- More Experienced Researchers (MER) > 10 years


All nationalities

- the 27 member states(MS)
- the associated countries (AC)

(Switzerland, Israel, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Turkey, Croatia, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Serbia, Albania, Montenegro, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Faroe Islands, Republic of Moldova)

- the third countries

Definition of mobility in the MCA (1)

- Appreciation of the mobility and conditions of nationality:
 - Researchers must be of a different nationality from that of the host laboratory.
 - They should not have stayed longer than 12 month in the host country during the 3 years preceding the deadline of the submission.
- Special conditions for binationals:
 - Possible mobility in one of the countries of nationality in which the researcher has not be resident during the previous 5 ears.




Definition of mobility in the MCA(2)

- Special conditions after a long period in a third country:
 MS or AC nationals can perform their mobility in their country of
 origin, if they can justify that they have resided legally and exercised
 an activity in a third country for at least 3 years during the previous 4
 years.
- Special conditions for third-country nationals:
 Third country researchers who have resided legally and exercised an activity in a MS or AC for at least 3 years during the previous 4 years, are assimilated to nationals of MS or AC in which they have resided the longest.

The different MCA

- 8 actions :
 - 1 for early stage researchers (40% budget)
 - 7 for experienced researchers (60% du budget)
- Among the 7 actions dedicated to experienced researchers:
 - 4 are individual grants: the researcher applies directly to the EC
 - For 3 of them, the research organisation is the applicant



Fellowships for experienced researchers



Intra European Fellowship (IEF)

Goal:

 Carrier development of experienced researchers, diversification of skills and competencies by fostering the pluri and interdisciplinary or intersectorial experiences

Candidate:

Researcher in collaboration with the host institution

Potential beneficiary:

Experienced researchers (12 to 24 month stay)

Eligible cost:

- Salary and expenses of the recruited researcher
- Management and Overheads



Carrier Integration Grant (CIG)

Goal:

 To encourage researchers to establish in a MS or AC in attracting and retaining the best elements in Europe. Increase the chances of mobile researchers to find a stable position by providing a research budget. Promote the transfer of knowledge and transnational cooperation.

Candidate:

 Researcher of any nationality in collaboration with a host laboratory (public or private) of a MS or AC that is committed to recruit and pay the salaries of the researcher.

Potential beneficiary:

Experienced researchers ER or MER (stay 12 to 48 months)

Eligible cost:

25 000 € /year / researcher



COFUND

Goal:

 Leveraging transnational fellowships programs, both outgoing, incoming and reintegration. Promoting interdisciplinarity and intersectorial experience.

Candidate:

 1 institution of an MS or AC managing a fellowships program promoting transnational mobility or willing to create one.

Potential beneficiary:

Experienced researchers ER or MER (stay 12 to 24 months)

Eligible cost:

- EU contribution of 40% of the total cost of the program
- Max. of 10 million by institution and by call



Industry-Academia Partnerships and Pathways(IAPP)

Goal:

Creation of partnerships between the academic world and industry through the implementation of joint projects and encouraging the sharing of knowledge and cultural exchange (in particular with SMEs)

Candidate:

- At least 2 participants (1 from each sector) from different countries (MS/AC)
- Intranationale, intersectorielle mobility aloud up to a maximum de 30%

Potential beneficiary:

- Recruitment of experienced researchers (12 to 24 month stay)
- Secondment of staff/researcher in the early career or experienced (2 to 24 months)

Eligible cost:

- Salary and expenses of recruited researchers and exchanged staff
- Networking, Conferences, Management costs and Overheads



International Outgoing Fellowships (IOF) Goal:

• Strengthening the international dimension of the career of researchers allowing them to work in a third country institution and to return to Europe to transfer their experience.

Candidate:

Researcher in collaboration with host institution

Potential beneficiary:

 Experienced researchers (outgoing stay from 12 to 24 months and mandatory return phase of 12 months)

Eligible cost:

- Salary and expenses of recruited researchers
- Management and Overheads

International Incoming Fellowships (IIF) Goal:

 To allow the exchange of expertise between European and third country entities by providing financial support to individual projects of top researchers from third countries

Candidate:

Researcher in collaboration with host institution

Potential beneficiary:

 Experienced researchers (stay from 12 to 24 months and possible return phase of 12 months for researchers originating of the ICPC list countries: International Cooperation Partner Countries) ftp://ftp.cordis.europa.eu/pub/fp7/docs/wp/cooperation/cooperation-general-annexes201101_en.pdf

Eligible cost:

- Salary and expenses of recruited researchers
- Management and Overheads
- Return Phase: flat-rate of 15 000 euros per year per researcher

International Research Staff Exchange Scheme (IRSES)

Goal:

• Strengthening partnerships between research teams through personnel exchanges and network activities between the EU and the third countries (signatory of an S & T Agreement or in the process of negotiation)

Candidate:

 Minimum 2 academic or research organizations in a MS or AC and at least one organization located in a third country having an S & T agreement with the EU or within the EU neighbourhood policy.

Potential beneficiary:

• Early stage researchers & experienced researchers and technical or administrative staff (project from 24 to 48 months, stays of 1 to 12 months)

Eligible cost:

Flat-rate of €1900 per exchanged staff member / month



Eligible countries for IRSES beside MS et AC

 Countries having an international S & T agreement with the EU

Algeria, Argentina, Australie§, Brazil, Canada§, Chile, China, Egypt, India, Japon§, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, New Zelande§, Republic of Corea§, Russia, South Africa, Tunisia, Ukraine, United States §.

- The neighbourhood policy countries :
 - ✓ the Eastern partnership countries:
 Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine.
 - ✓ the Euromed partnership countries (non AC): Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, territories under the Administration of the Palestinian Authority, Syria, Tunisia
 - ✓ § For these countries, the costs of researchers coming to Europe is not funded by IRSES



Fellowships for early stage researchers



Initial Training Network (ITN)

Goal:

- Strengthening and structuring training to and by research of high quality in Europe for young researchers (researchers stays, conferences, invited researchers, training modules)
- Improve the prospects for careers by developing complementary, innovative skills as well scientists as more transversal
- Attracting young people to career in science

Candidates:

Minimum 3 institutions (academic or private) in a MS or AC

Potential beneficiary:

- Early stage researchers (stay from 3 to 36 months)
- Experienced researchers (but with less than 5 years of experience) (stay limited to a maximum of 24 months)

Eligible cost:

- Salaries and expenses of researchers recruited and invited
- Conferences, Management and Overheads

European Industrial Doctorates (EID)

Candidates:

- 2 (1 in each sector) located in different MS or AC
- Researchers must be recruited by at least one of the participants, be part of a doctoral program and spend at least 50% of their time in the private sector

Potential beneficiary:

Early stage researchers (stay from 3 to 36 months)

Eligible cost:

- Salaries and expenses of the recruited researchers and invited researchers
- Conferences
- Management and Overheads



Innovative Doctoral Programmes (IDP)

Goal:

Innovative training programme that takes into account the 3 "I"

Interdisciplinary

- ✓ Training in common for candidates of different domains
- ✓ Involving PhD students in multi-disciplinary projects

Intersectoriel

- Opportunity for PhD students to have researchers from the industry as mentors
- ✓ Researchers of the industry give lectures at university (ex: entrepreneurship...)
- ✓ Partners in industry provides jobs to doctorates

International

- ✓ Possibilities to follow courses abroad
- ✓ Common diploma with institutions abroad



Innovative Doctoral Programmes (IDP) (2)

Candidates:

 1 institution (academic) located in MS or AC and partners from other countries, other disciplines and other sectors

Potential beneficiary:

Early stage researchers (stay from 3 to 36 months)

Eligible cost:

- Salaries and expenses of the recruited researchers and invited researchers
- Conferences
- Management and Overheads



Funds: salaries and allowances

Gross annual salary of the staff member/researcher (to be x by the coefficient of the country) :

- Early stage researcher (ESR) < 4 years: 38 000 € per year
- Experiences researcher (ER) > 4 years or PhD : 58 500 € per year
- More Experienced researcher (MER) > 10 years: 87 500 € per year

Mobility allowance(x by the coefficient of the country):

700 € (without family) et 1000 € (with family)

Examples of coefficient by countries FR=116.1 -UK=134.4 - SP=97.7 - PL=85.0 -DE 94.8 etc.

- IIF return phase: 15 000 € per year per researcher
- CIG: 25 000 € per researcher per year
- IRSES: Flat-rate of €1900 per exchanged staff member / month Long distance allowance of €200 per exchanged staff member / month (eligible countries)
